

Pickleball: Fun and Exciting Paddle Sport



Pickleball is a fun and exciting paddle sport for people of all ages and levels of athletic ability, and one of the fastest growing sports in the US and around the world. It is easy for beginners to learn, and a challenging, fast-paced, competitive game for more experienced players.

Pickleball combines many elements of tennis, badminton, and ping-pong. It is played as doubles or singles, both indoors and outdoors on a badminton-sized court (about one-third the size of a tennis court) with a paddle and hard plastic ball.

Beginners can learn to play the game in about 30 minutes and quickly become proficient. Those with previous experience with racquet or paddle sports can rapidly become very competitive. Pickleball is a very social game as well as being a great workout and a whole lot of fun.

Salvation Army Says Thank You



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
